IMPORTANT NOTICES FOR EXHIBITORS

CAR PARK & ADMISSION

CAR PARK: If you are only exhibiting at WEDA Open Show, you will need to pay £3.00 for car parking (£5.00 on the day). You will also need an exhibitors pass. When completing your entry form, tick the box indicating you are only showing at WEDA, otherwise no pass will be sent.

DISABLED PARKING

Exhibit official Government disc and you will be shown to the special disabled car park.

Bath Canine Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to vehicles in the car parks, caravan park or showground.

ATTRACTING OF EXHIBITS

Attracting of the attention of a dog whilst it is being judged, by any method, from the ringside is **prohibited**.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO RIGHTS

Express written permission from the organisers is required, without which filming and recording is prohibited. Similarly for taking photographs for reward. Press photographers have permission ONLY to use their work in newspapers and on internet sites. Private individuals are allowed to take photographs for private use only. Dogs may only be photographed with the consent of the owner. Filming/photography is not allowed in rings during judging, but judges may permit it at the end of classes. Outside the ring, photography is permitted, but flash, if it is affecting exhibits, may cause a judge or ring steward to ask you not to use it.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 9.00 am.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 11.00 am.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry Fees: Members £5.00 per dog for the first entry; free of charge for each subsequent entry with the same dog; Non-Members £7.00 per dog for the first entry; £1.00 for each subsequent entry with the same dog; Not for Competition £1.00 per dog (please provide details on entry form). Membership: Annual: Single £4.00; Joint £5.00. Life: Single £4.00; Joint £5.00. Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries (£3.50 on the day of the Show). Advertisements: Full Page £5.00; Half Page £3.00; Trade (full page only): £10.00.
- Prize Money: Best in Show £10.00; Reserve Best in Show £5.00; Best Puppy in Show £10.00; Reserve Best Puppy in Show £5.00; Best Veteran in Show £10.00.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy). A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively.

11. Best in Show

The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from Best of Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register). Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show.

- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move.</u> This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday
 route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - · If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available
 to drink
 - · Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - · When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
 Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results.
 Please look after your dog's welfare.
 WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.
- 17. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 18. No modifications will be made to the Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- Should any question or matter arise not provided for in these Regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club.
- Should any judge be unable to fulfil their appointment, the Committee reserve to themselves the right to appoint another in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
- 21. The Committee will be empowered to exclude or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from illness, disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place either before or after judging the entry fee will be forfeited.

- 22. The Committee will not be responsible for claims for injury or compensation occasioned by or arising from the holding of the Show or reason of act or default of any person.
- 23. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act of omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 24. No animal other than a Dachshund duly entered at the Show, will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
- 25. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 26. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
- 27. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
- 28. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Monday, 23rd April 2018.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- (1) Withdrawal
 - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.
- (2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate or Reserve Challenge Certificate.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN 7 - 9 YEARS For dogs of not less than seven years of age nor more than nine years of age (i.e. have not reached their tenth birthday) on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN 10+ YEARS For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

SHOW NOTICES

NO UNENTERED DOGS ALLOWED WITHIN THE SHOW PRECINCTS

DOGS IN VEHICLES / UNENTERED DOGS

Bath Canine Society regret that they are unable to provide a tent for the unentered dogs. Unentered dogs should be entered as NOT FOR COMPETITION (NFC), see below.

<u>Do not</u> leave dogs unattended in vehicles. Bath Canine Society operates a policy of ZERO TOLERANCE. Car park admission passes must be displayed at all times in the vehicle and when the breed in question is identified, judging in that ring will cease until the dog(s) are removed and the issue resolved.

NOT FOR COMPETITION (NFC)

Anyone wishing to attened the show is welcome to bring a dog, provided it has been entered for the show using the normal entry form in this schedule (or similar). Dachshund puppies aged between 4 and 6 months of age on the day of the show may be entered 'Not for Competition'. Simply supply as much information as possible (name and date of birth essential) and put 'NFC' in the column marked classes, and send to the Secretary with the fee of £1.00 per dog. No unentered dog may be taken into the show area in any circumstances.

EXERCISE AREA

Please only exercise dogs in the designated area and clear up any fouling immediately (bags provided).

HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY STATEMENT

It is the policy of the Officers and Committee of the West of England Dachshund Association to provide a safe and secure area for exhibitors to show their dogs.



ROUTES TO THE SHOW

- 1 FROM NORTH WEST, GLASGOW: M74 A74 M6 to Birmingham M5 to Almondsbury interchange (near Bristol) M4 East towards London. Leave M4 at Junction 18 (see 5).
- 2 **FROM NORTH EAST, EDINBURGH:** A1 A1(M) Into M1 South, off at Junction 23A for M42 for 56 miles, into M5 to junction with M4 (Junction 15), east to Junction 18 (see 5).
- 3 FROM THE EAST, NORFOLK, LONDON, KENT: A1 North; A12 Norfolk; A2 Kent; A20 Kent: M3 Sussex. Join M4 westbound. leave M4 at Junction 18 (see 5).
- 4 FROM THE SOUTH & SOUTH WEST, CORNWALL: A30 to Exeter Honiton by-pass A303 Ilminster Ilchester A37 Shepton Mallet A367 Bath A4 Chippenham. Turn left at Batheaston Fiveways Garage to RAF Colerne/Bannerdown.
 - **ALTERNATIVE SOUTH COAST:** A38 Plymouth Exeter by-pass Taunton A361 to Glastonbury A39 Wells Midsomer Norton Bath A4 to Chippenham. Turn left at Batheaston Fiveways Garage to RAF Colerne/Bannerdown.
 - **ALTERNATIVE FROM EXETER:** M5 to Almondsbury Interchange M4 eastbound to London, leave M4 at Junction 18 (see 5).
- 5 **FROM M4 MOTORWAY, JUNCTION 18:** Take A46 South for approx. 8 miles. Just before dual carriageway take slip road onto A4 (signposted Bath A4, Chippenham A4). Turn left at roundabout signposted Batheaston local. After 1 mile turn left onto Bannerdown Road RAC signposted to Show. Alternatively, from A46 turn left onto A420 and turn right at Marshfield following signs to Colerne. (Unsuitable for caravans).
